

# **MARSHALL COUNTRY CLUB**

## **Introduction**

The introduction of this code of conduct is to establish clear and acceptable behavior expectations of all Marshall Country Club members, guests, and public play. The Code of Conduct shall not be construed to restrict the rights of any player; rather, this Code of Conduct is established to ensure that Marshall Country Club employees and contractors, all players, are treated with respect while enjoying Marshall Country Club and its services. Marshall Country Club deems that upon the premises, players, guests, public have given their consent to be bound by this Code of Conduct.

## **Expectations**

All players and guests shall:

- Conduct themselves in a sportspersons-like manner and observe all applicable rules and standards of etiquette and fair play.
- Respect the rights of others and refrain from any activities that to a reasonable person constitute harassment, threatening behavior, whether verbal or non-verbal in nature of abuse.
- Not engage in any verbal and non-verbal form of sexual, racial, religious, or cultural discrimination or harassment.
- Ensure all behavior complies with this Code of Conduct and all other applicable Marshall Country Club policies, USGA and local rules, regulations and legal (state, city, township) laws, dress code, ordinances, and any other instructions to ensure safety of all participants.
- Respect the golf course, golf carts and facilities.
- Dispose of trash appropriately.
- Fix all divots on the green.
- Properly and promptly repair divots/ball marks on fairway.
- Rake bunkers. Place rake in bunker parallel to fairway.
- Let faster players play through. Foursomes have the right of way.

- Operate golf carts no closer than twenty feet to the green and in designated areas only.
- Seek Pro Shop approval before commencing a round on the back nine holes or any other hole on the course.
- Obey all signage and areas cordoned off by white/green stakes.
- All outside food and beverages including alcohol are prohibited on the course and grounds.
- No smoking of any kind is allowed within the clubhouse or pro shop. This includes e-cigarettes.
- Refrain from playing loud music or other media in a manner that distracts and disturbs other players on the course and grounds.
- Refrain from borrowing and removing MCC property or assets without prior authorization.
- Refrain from deliberate or careless damage or destruction of MCC property, or that of any member, guest, players, or employees. The person is responsible for damage reimbursement.
- Abide by all state and local laws and regulations including the possession of any illegal drugs, explosives, firearms, and weapons on the grounds of MCC.

### **Golfer Dress Code**

- Shirts must always be worn, including collared polo shirts, mock neck, bomber neck; T-shirts are permitted before Memorial Day and after Labor Day. Tucked and untucked tops are permissible.
- Women's slacks, shorts, skirts and skorts are acceptable; denim jeans without holes are permitted before Memorial Day and after Labor Day. Tucked and untucked shirts/tops are permissible.
- Men's slacks and shorts are acceptable, denim jeans without holes are permitted only before Memorial Day and after Labor Day.
- Footwear-Athletic shoes, soft spiked golf shoes are permitted, no metal spikes, heeled shoes, or boots, are prohibited.
